Minister of Interior

Three-time interior minister, in 1993, 1995 and 2016, Hammad holds two diplomas in public and local administration from Paris, on top of his bachelor's degree in law from Baghdad University in 1969.

He has served in multiple government positions in Amman and Agaba and supervised Salameh Hammad the House of Representatives' elections, among other official roles.



Hammad was awarded the Independence Order of the Second Class and Al Kawkab Order of the Second Class for his service.

Minister of Planning and **International Development** and State Minister for **Economic Affairs**

Eses was recently an adviser to His Majesty King Abdullah. A former director of the Social and Economic Development Administration at His Majesty King Abdullah's Office, with the Royal Hashemite Court, and holder of Mohammad Eses four degrees from the University



of Harvard, Eses is a prominent Jordanian researcher, academic and economic planning specialist.

He is a member of the Arab World Council with the World Economic Forum and winner of multiple global grants and awards from Harvard, Fulbright and the American University in Cairo.

Eses was head of the Civil Service Bureau and had served in a number of official positions in Jordan and the Arab world, the last of which was head of the strategic planning department with the Central Bank of the UAE.

Holding a master's degree in quality management and institutional excellence from University of Wollongong, Australia and a bachelor's degree in law, Bataineh served as director of the Civil Service Bureau and held a number of leading governmental posts outside Jordan, Nidal Bataineh including director of strategic



planning department at the Central Bank of the UAE. Bataineh is a member of the European Corporate Governance Institute.

Minister of State for Institutional **Performance Development**

Former minister of public sector development under the Mulki government, Ghosheh served as executive director of the King Abdullah II Centre for Excellence since its establishment in 2006 and as deputy director of the Royal Court's economics and development directorate.



She was also named by Royal Decree as coordinator for the King Abdullah II Award for Excellence in Government Performance and Transparency, in the years 2004-2006.

Ghosheh carries two master's degrees in commercial and corporate law and was awarded the Order of Al Hussein for Distinguished Contribution of the Second Class.
